

Mill Village Borough Minutes: Wednesday June 1, 2022

President Linda Falconer called the Mill Village Borough Council meeting for June 1, 2022 to order at 6:32 p.m.

Those also present were Council Members: Edward Falconer, Shawn McLaughlin, and Steve Yovich. Also, in attendance were Mayor Joe Sam and Secretary/Treasurer Catherine Wise. Guests: Dara Kuhn, Dawson Bogert, Drew Watkins, Dave Stearns. Solicitor Tim Sennett attended by phone. Ainsley Strong arrived at 6:40 p.m. Attorney Buzz Andrezeski arrived at 6:51 p.m.

Edward Falconer motioned to accept the agenda, Steve Yovich seconded, all in favor, motion carried.

Steve Yovich motioned to pass the Consent Agenda including the Minutes from the Regular meeting – May 4, 2022 and the Treasurer's Report for May 31, 2022. Edward Falconer seconded motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Steve Yovich made a motion to pay payroll and monthly bills for May 31, 2022 seconded by Shawn McLaughlin. All voted yes.

Attorney Buzz Andrezeski stated that the proposed revised Fire Department Billing Ordinance presented by Tim Sennett is a fair and accurate ordinance. A public hearing will need to be held. The Ordinance will only cover Mill Village Borough. LeBoeuf Township and Rockdale Township would need to adopt a similar ordinance.

Steve Yovich motioned to advertise the proposed Fire Department Billing Ordinance. No seconded. Motion died for a lack of a second. Solicitor Tim Sennett cited cases, he stated that changes can be made and modified at a Public Hearing. Council members were asked to review the Proposed Ordinance and

forward suggestions for modifications to Solicitor Tim Sennett and Attorney Buzz Anfrezeski. Steve Yovich motioned to advertise for a Public Hearing. Linda Falconer seconded. All voted yes.

The Dollar General roof has been finished. The store may be opened by the end of June. The Escrow Account will need to be billed for expenses.

T.C. Paving fixed the intersection at Mackey Hill and Old Meadville Roads for \$355.00.
