

Mill Village Borough Minutes: Wednesday November 2, 2022

President Linda Falconer called the Mill Village Borough Council meeting for November 2, 2022 to order at 6:30 p.m.

Those also present were Council Members: Edward Falconer, Ali Peters, Steve Yovich. Also, in attendance were and Secretary/Treasurer Catherine Wise and Mayor Joe Sam.

Edward Falconer motioned to accept the agenda, Steve Yovich seconded, all in favor, motion carried.

Ali Peters motioned to pass the Consent Agenda including the Minutes from the Regular meeting – October 5, 2022 and the Treasurer's Report for October 31, 2022. Steve Yovich seconded motion. All in favor, motion carried.
